Caitlin Molechat has been a choral director, soprano soloist, and professional choral singer in the Dallas area for twenty-one years. She is very excited to be back at First UMC Richardson working with students of all ages. Caitlin conducts The Journey Youth Choir, Jubilation Choir, Young Adult Choir, and works with the Modern Worship Choir and various Chancel Choir Ensembles. Caitlin also currently sings with the professional choir, Orpheus Chamber Singers. Other groups have included Project Eve (as Artistic Director and singer), Texas Choral Artists, Dallas Bach Society, and the Collegium Early Music Singers, among others.



She graduated summa cum laude with an M.M. in Choral Conducting and a B.M. in Music Education from the University of North Texas, where she studied with Jerry McCoy and served as Associate Conductor of the UNT A Cappella Choir. She has done post-graduate self-study in England, Germany, and the Netherlands. While living overseas in Amsterdam, she conducted a semi-professional choir of twenty-four singers. She has taught secondary choral music and has worked as the Associate Director of Music and Arts in Dallas churches for many years. She currently lives in Dallas with her husband and three children.





Mr. Spencer is a graduate of Texas Wesleyan University in Fort Worth, where he received the Law Sone Outstanding Graduate Award, played for numerous ensembles, received the Elizabeth Means Armstrong scholarship in music, and was named a Presser Scholar. Antoine holds a Master's Degree in Public School Administration from the University of North Texas. Mr. Spencer has served in public schools for thirty-five years as a teacher and principal, and currently serves as the Director of Research and Accountability for Plano ISD.

Antoine has accompanied various choral ensembles in the Dallas/Fort Worth area, played at Carnegie Hall, the Meyerson Symphony Center, on many recordings, and traveled extensively with choruses in the U.S. and Europe. Serving as church pianist for most of his life, Antoine currently accompanies the Journey Youth Choir at FUMC <u>Richardson.</u>

Antoine Spencer was recognized by the Texas State Legislature in 1997 for outstanding accomplishments, and has received numerous awards including the Texas Legislative Black Caucus Outstanding Texan Award, Red Oak ISD Support Professional of the Year, Dallas ISD Teacher of the Year, Rick Alford Award of Excellence in Music Ministry, and two Honorary Texas PTA Life Membership Awards.




KYLE O'NEIL Assistant Director

Fun fact: He plays 3 instruments: oboe, trombone, and piano. Playlist: Paul Simon, The Cars, and other various artists






